Make "dog biscuit" cookies. Use your favorite rolled cookie recipe or prepared dough from the dairy section of the grocery store. Let the children help measure, mix and roll the dough. Cut the dough into narrow rectangles. Roll 4 small balls of dough for each dog biscuit. Place the rectangles on cookie sheets with plenty of room between cookies. Place two of the small balls at both ends of each rectangle. Mash the balls flat, overlapping with the rectangles, creating a bone shape. Bake according to directions and serve following a storytime featuring dog stories.
